The School Registration Period for new students will take place Monday, January 27 to Friday, February 7th, 2020. It is very important to complete this application process as it ensures that we know our numbers and are able to organize efficiently for your child's arrival in the fall. Please note that the age four pre-kindergarten program has a limited number of spaces and children are accepted on a first come, first served basis.

The School re-registration period for returning students will take place on line between February 3 & February 14, 2020. Instructions will be made available closer to the date. If your email has changed since November, please let the school know at your earliest convenience.
